She built relationships that carried over as she left for Texas to marry the boy she met on a cruise ship in Alaska in 2003. She said the happiest day of her life was when she learned she was pregnant with her son, Easton. It was at that time she explained to her husband it was time to go home to Momma and Daddy in Alabama. After the birth of Easton she recognized her true calling in life was being a mommy. She relished this role of being a homemaker, taking care of her family, and making sure they had everything she could give them to succeed, mainly her love. Colby loved to document the accomplishments and stepping stones of her small family through pictures and clever comments on Facebook and Instagram. In addition to her talents as wife and mother, she had a passion for crafts and a slight addiction to Pinterest even starting up a wreath making business, Dixieland Décor, while in Crossville.
