



Jackie Shipp McDaniel

January 15, 1931 - January 7, 2024

Jackie Shipp McDaniel, aged 92, of Crossville, Alabama, passed away peacefully at his home on January 7, 2023 after a brief illness. Jackie was born the youngest of 3 children on January 15, 1931 to parents, Jim and Vera McDaniel.

Jackie, or Coach Mac, as he was affectionately called by many, was a lifelong resident of Crossville and a graduate of Crossville High School. He was received a Bachelor's degree from Jacksonville State University and a Master's degree from the University of Alabama. Coach Mac became a teacher at Crossville High School and coached football, basketball, and baseball. He enjoyed spending time with his beloved wife, Billie, and their family. After Coach Mac's retirement from teaching, he and Billie traveled extensively with cherished friends, J. T. and Pat Keys. He was an avid sports fan and attended or watched sporting events as often as he could. He also loved deer hunting and fishing. He was a devout and active member of Crossville Community Church.

Coach Mac was preceded in death by his parents, Jim and Vera McDaniel; his wife of 58 years, Billie Naylor McDaniel; his sister, Martha Shipp Wood; and his brother, Jim McDaniel.

He is survived by his son, David McDaniel (Jennifer) of Austin, TX; daughter

Cheryl Jordan (Joe) of Carrollton, GA; grandsons, John McDaniel (Amanda), James McDaniel (Alyson), Nick McDaniel (Rachel), and Joey Jordan; granddaughters, Holly Jordan (David), Heather Jordan, and Hannah Jordan; and 3 great-grandchildren, Millie Virginia McDaniel, Lillian Jane Jordan, and Quinn June Jordan.

Visitation for Jackie Shipp McDaniel will be Wednesday evening, January 10, from 5-7pm at Crossville Memorial Chapel. The body will lie in state on Thursday, January 11, from 12-1pm at Crossville Community Church, followed by the funeral at 1pm with burial afterward at Crossville Cemetery. Pastor Keith Monk, Bro. Willis Kelly and Bro. Harvey Beck will be officiating with a eulogy being given by Jackie's grandson, James McDaniel. Pallbearers are Larry Shipp, Jacky Thrift, Eddie Rhodes, Jimmy Williamson, Joey Jordan, and David Zaun.
